2026 Camp Dates, Content, & Schedule

Camp dates

Make Your Own Musical Camp will take place over two weeks: August 10-14, (week one), and August 17-21 (week 2).

Camp Content:

In this unique summer camp, students will engage in every part of the creation of a musical play from start to finish. Starting from scratch participants will: put their idea to page with a script, compose lyrics and composition, help design and construct their set, stage and choreograph the show, and finally put it all together on stage.



Along with games, warm-up activities, and breaks for snack/lunch, students will have daily classes in voice, dance, and theatre by professionals in their respective fields, and will directly apply what they learn to the creation of a short musical showcase. Classes may include (but are not limited to):

- Projection, enunciation, and voice work
- Physical theatre, body language, and characterization
- Improv and teamwork skills
- Basics of stage and rehearsal etiquette
- Playwriting basics (story structure and writing a play)
- Composition/lyrics
- Vocal exercises
- Dance technique
- Choreography

Age and experience:

No experience in musical theatre is needed but students should have a willingness to learn, take on responsibility as growing storytellers, and experiment with new concepts as a team.

This is a camp for students aged 8+. While there is no upper age limit, content will be directed towards pre-teens and young teenagers, and serves as an introduction to many aspects of musical theatre.

Students who are interested in camp but who **do not want** to be onstage in the final showcase are welcome to join camp as part of a design/tech team (stage management and helpers, bringing the show to life from backstage). We will do our best to accommodate all student's interests but **please note** the majority of camp class time will focus on performance aspects of musical theatre – additional instruction in theatre tech is not guaranteed.

Daily Schedule

Along with games, warm-up activities, and breaks for snack/lunch, students will have daily classes in voice, dance, and theatre. The complete schedule is to be determined – see the schedule below for an approximate of how a day at camp will go.

4:15 – 5:00	Free play and pick-up

There will be a final showcase at the end of day on August 24 (the exact schedule will be sent out closer to August). This will last 10-15 minutes.

Pick-up / drop off

Our programming runs from 9 a.m. to 4:15 p.m. on Monday to Friday at the Atlantic Ballet studios (68 Highfield Street, Moncton). Early drop-off starts at 8:30 a.m. and ends at 9. Pick-up begins at 4:15 pm and lasts until 5:00 p.m.

Participants picked up after 5:00pm will be charged an additional fee of 1\$/minute (pick-up at 5:15 = 15\$ charge, etc).



Inclusion policy and General code of conduct

The School of Atlantic Ballet is an inclusive facility and is fully accessible to all children and their families regardless of their race, colour, religion, national origin, ancestry, place of origin, age, disability, marital status, real or perceived sexual orientation and/or gender identity, sex, social condition or political belief or activity (New Brunswick Human Rights Act, 2011).

We proudly employ many new Canadians, and our student body is proportionally representative of the diversity of the Greater Moncton community.

Our facilities are equipped with elevator access, wide doorways, large washroom facilities, and large activity spaces.

General code of conduct

We reserve the right to refuse admittance to any person who jeopardizes our ability to provide a positive and supportive atmosphere. Disrespectful or disruptive behaviour or language is not appropriate and will not be tolerated. Please be courteous in your dealings with our teachers, reception personnel and staff. Parents displaying disrespectful or inflammatory behaviour or conduct will be asked to leave the School and such behaviour may result in the discharge of their child from the program.

Bullying, harassment and intimidation of fellow students will not be tolerated. Any such behaviour on the part of a student may result in dismissal from the camp.

Daily attendance

Being present is highly important in the collaborative process of creating and rehearsing a story together. Please inform the office if a student will be absent from any period of MYOM Camp as soon as possible. No refunds or discounts will be applied for missing days.



What to bring / wear:

Students attending MYOM camp should bring comfortable clothing that allows for full range of movement (for dance, play, and rehearsal), a water bottle, snacks (for two snack breaks) and a lunch. Schedule permitting, we will take several supervised trips to local playgrounds during the camp– sunscreen is encouraged as well for those days.

Items / props from home

Closer to the showcase day, students may be encouraged to bring items from home to the studio to help with costume / prop needs (with the instructor/family's permission). This encourages students to build collective responsibility as story-makers, but staff will endeavor to keep track of items and ensure they are returned.

Snacks and lunch

Please bring snacks and a lunch daily – there will be two breaks for snack between class time. Microwave access is permitted with supervision.

Please note that **we are a nut-free facility**, but it is the parent / student's responsibility to inform the School of any allergies or health conditions.

Tuition and registration

Tuition and deposit fees

Early-bird tuition (until July 1st) for the two-week camp is 400\$. After July 1st the total camp cost is 425\$. This includes a non-refundable 50\$ deposit to reserve your / your child's place in the camp.

Students who withdraw from the camp before July 27th will be refunded tuition minus the deposit fee.



A refund for withdrawal / registration cancellations made after July 27th is not guaranteed.

Full tuition must be paid by August 7th.

Payment

Payment can be made through DSP (Dance Studio Pro) or by e-transfer to accountant@atlanticballet.ca

Please note: Your registration is **Not Complete** (your spot in the camp is not reserved) until registration form is submitted and the deposit has been paid.

If for any reason Make your Own Musical camp is cancelled or unable to run, a full refund will be issued.
